Great to see new members joining us and a few new faces as guests on our rides recently. The weather remains a Pain in the proverbial but as no one can control the weather I can only recommend that if a weekend ride day arrives and the forecast is for fine weather or only a few showers that you take the opportunity presented and GET ON YA BIKE!

I thought that I would talk about our ride rules and the reasons why we have them just to refresh everyone's memory and help any newer member get to grips with what they are. In no particular order here goes

 Attend the ride with a full tank of Fuel by the starting time. The poor old ride Captains try very hard to make the rides enjoyable and work out stops based on the lowest range Bike on the day. There is nothing worse than being informed at the first bum rest that we need to find a fuel



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station because someone forgot to Fuel up.

- Ride in staggered formation. Why I hear you ask? Well for a couple of reasons. A) It allows for stopping space in front of you if you need to hit the Brakes. B) You can move left or right in your lane to avoid bumps and potholes and take a good line into corners. If someone is directly beside you are forced to use only half the lane.
- 3. Keep the person behind you in your mirror. This rule was set so that we do not loose anyone it does not mean that you need to have the rider behind you in sight all of the time just be comfortable that they are there by viewing them every 5 to 10 minutes on a clear stretch where it is safe for you to do so. If someone comes off we want to know and help them (hope this never happens).
- 4. If leading a ride when you overtake pretend you are

towing a long trailer and keep going until there is enough space for everyone following to fit in front of the vehicle you have overtaken. It is scary when the leader overtakes and then pulls up without a space for the rest to fit in and they can get trapped in the oncoming lane.

- 5. Try and keep the ride together as much as it is safe to do so. There is nothing more frustrating and distracting than a rider in the pack continually falling behind because they are riding well below the speed limit. It takes a lot of effort to continually fall back and wait for these riders to catch up. We do not want anyone trying to ride beyond there capability so in these situations the ride captain can make a decision and if confident that the slower riser is OK and knows where we are going they can take the ride ahead and wait at the next nominated stop for the slower person.
- 6. Mark the corners. It is very important that when a ride turns from one road to another that the last person to reach the corner stop and wait until the person riding behind them come into view and know that the ride is turning off onto a new road.
- 7. Leaving the ride mid way The ride leader will signal by waving their hand above their head during a ride and this indicates that anyone who wants to may leave the ride and meet us at the next stop. This is to enable riders some flexibility in deciding to take a different route and try different roads etc. The ride will always follow the set route and legal pace or slower so leaving the ride and rejoining later provides the opportunity to ride freestyle unencumbered by formation and checking mirrors etc. Of course the Club does not and will not condone any breaking of road rules and is not responsible for the behaviors of individual riders. As this is free country we support your right to choose and be responsible for your own choices!

These ride rules are not exhaustive and if you would like to see the full list then please just ask a committee member for a look at the rules and guidelines. Stay safe, have fun and lets all enjoy our rides Best regards **Sarge**

We left Maccas and headed out to Rathdowney and around Mt Lindsay Forest and down into Kyogle for our first stop and to say our goodbyes to Jak. Most of us refuelled and then it was off again going down through Casino and into Grafton for lunch at the local on Prince street. The food was just what the doctor ordered. We left Grafton around 1.00 pm local time and took off to Glen Innes via the Gwydir Hwy. Boy what a beautiful stretch of road that is.
