



Thanks to all the members for the kind words about our Christmas Party. It was great to have early helpers to assist with unloading the trailer and just generally getting things organized.



Queensland police performance measured on number of tickets issued

POLICE performance will be measured on the number of tickets issued and arrests they make in a controversial move likened to the notorious "kill

sheet" where quotas are set. Officers at a major Brisbane station were told a "monthly performance sheet system" would be issued to "assist in would be issued to "assist in identifying any shortfalls, fail-ings or weaknesses" so they could be addressed before performance development reviews. "At present I am looking at measuring performance against tasks, domestic viol-ence incidents, full briefs, traffic

tickets, street checks and so on," the memo sent to staff said. Tasks more than three months old would require an explanation by the officer as to why they were not completed. "The sheet would also have facility for officers with little or

no figures to provide an expla-nation as to what they have done for the month." The memo asked for feed-back from officers as to what

should be measured. Officers who spoke to The Courier-Mail likened the con-

tents of the memo to the reintroduction of "kill sheets", in which police were given targets or quotas. "Policing, by its very nature,

does not allow officers to be compared on a monthly basis, to compare work performance (output) against their peers,' said. officer

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vice did not respond to ques-tions about the memo but said the organisation supported reasonable management action and expected its members to perform to a high standard. The memo follows one sent to a Brisbane traffic branch that sumastand minimum tickat

that suggested minimum ticket uotas during a trial of a new ticketing system.

"There is no hiding during "There is no hiding during this period," the 2015 memo said. "I would suggest a mini-mum of 10 tickets per shift/ every shift (that is only one ticket every 48 minutes)."

THE Queensland Police Commissioner says comparisons of a new "monthly performance sheet" system with pre-Fitzgerald-era "kill sheets" are a misrepresentation of the facts.

Overnight, *The Courier-Mail* reported that the performance of officers at a major Brisbane police station would be measured on the number of tickets issued and arrests made.

Officers were told the system would be issued to identify any shortfalls, failings or weaknesses so they could be addressed before performance development reviews.

Police officers who spoke to The Courier-Mail likened the contents of the memo to the reintroduction of "kill sheets", in which police were given targets or quotas.

But Commissioner Ian Stewart said today he did not believe the memo was anything more than an officer being a good leader and supervisor. Oueensland Police Commissioner Ian Stewart rejects comparisons with 'kill sheets'.

"We don't use 'kill sheets'; what we do have is some very innovative and very good officers who are managers of other staff, and we give them licence, we allow them to manage their staff appropriately, and that's what's happened on this occasion," he said.

"We don't believe it is anything more than a good officer who is a leader and a supervisor, who we hold accountable for the performance of the unit.

"That officer has simply been doing their job to the best of their

ability, and I back them a 100 per cent.

"What they put out

was not a 'kill sheet', it was simply a way of trying to manage disparate staff."

Mr Stewart admitted the memo, which he had seen, may have been poorly worded, but said it had been misinterpreted.



"What I'm saying very very clearly is I back my officers-in-charge; they've got a very tough job to do, as do our frontline police," he said.

"Quotas are out; they've never been part of the organisation since way way back. I really believe this is just a misinterpretation of what was intended."

The memo read, in part: "At present I am looking at measuring performance against tasks, domestic violence incidents, full briefs, traffic tickets, street checks and so on."

Tasks more than three months old would require an explanation by the officer as to why it was not completed, the memo said.

"The sheet would also have facility for officers with little or no figures to provide an explanation as to what they have done for the month," it said.

The memo asked for feedback from officers as to what should be measured.

Queensland Police Union president Ian Leavers says the latest actions 'appear to be reasonable'.

QPU president Ian Leavers said the union repudiated the concept of quotas for arrests and infringement notices issued by police.

But he said in this instance the actions taken "appear to be reasonable management practices" with the union continuing to monitor it.

The Queensland Police Service initially did not respond to a list of questions about the memo, but said the organisation supported reasonable management action and expected its members to perform to a high standard.

The review process provided a framework for individual performance management to be achieved through discussing, negotiating, planning, reviewing and documenting employee progress towards achieving the objectives and standards required.

Do carbon wheels match hype?

There is a lot of hype about carbon wheels improving handling and braking, but do they really live up to that hype? I've ridden many bikes with carbon wheels, but never been able to compare them back-to-back to a bike with heavier standard wheels. Until now.

South African carbon manufacturer Blackstone TEK supplied a set of Black Diamond wheels for our 2006 Ducati GT1000 project bike. The

BST wheels weigh in at 3.2kg for the back and 2.4kg for the front. That compares with the standard wire spoked wheels (discs and sprocket removed) at a whopping 10.5kg for the rear wheel and 6.8kg for the front. That's a 70% less on the rear wheel and 65% less up front for an total weight saving of 11.7kg!

Feel the hype

The difference in feel was immediate as I rode away from Oliver's Motorcycles where they fitted the beautiful wheels using gloves and rags to protect them from any scratches. My Ducati felt instantly lighter through the handlebars. It tipped so deftly I had a little "moment" at the first turn when it tipped more than I expected. Countersteering becomes such a feather-light experience and the bike responds instantly by tipping and changing direction.

After riding the bike through the hills, I can say that the carbon hype is warranted. In fact, I'd say it is the single biggest change you can make to your bike's performance.

Ride Improved

Before fitting the wheels, I updated the suspension with Ikon shocks and progressive forks springs. There was still some "jackhammer" effect through the bars and I was considering some valve work in the forks. However, that harshness has now disappeared with the 65% lighter front wheel.

As an engineering friend of mine explains, the lightweight wheel means less unsprung weight and therefore not as much stress on the suspension. On hitting a bump, the initial part of the compression stroke should be the same. However, there should not be as much impetus on either the compression or rebound strokes with the lighter wheel.

That means the suspension works quicker which prevents a pogoing effect and keeps the wheel on the ground for more mechanical grip. That helps with acceleration and braking.



Steering, braking and acceleration



The rotating mass of a heavy wheel makes it difficult to change direction. A lighter wheel is much easier to turn. That means the steering is light and change of direction through a series of tight esses becomes quick and responsive to the lightest of counter steering input.

A light wheel will also start spinning and stop with less effort than a heavy wheel. Our tech Zac noticed this when he was spinning the wheel to balance it. The ramifications should be faster acceleration, improved braking and slightly better fuel economy, especially in

stop-start city traffic.

However, I wasn't expecting the effects to be so dramatic!

The bike seems more responsive to the throttle. Together with the lighter front wheel this results in the only drawback of carbon wheels – wheelies! While they are fun to execute, I found the bike wanted to wheelie over bumps in the first three gears, so I now have to weight the front wheel by moving forward in the saddle.

Braking is not only more effective, but also better controlled with a more sensitive feel in the levers. This makes trail braking with the rear brake much more controllable, even when wearing a big motorcycle boot. There is also more initial bite through the front lever.

I haven't noticed any difference in fuel economy. In fact, I probably won't because I think I'll be riding this harder!

Shattering experience

As for the hype about carbon wheels shattering on big impacts, I have not tested it and hope not to! However, one rider has commented on the BST website about hitting a kerb head -on at 80km/h and surviving. Not only did the wheel not shatter, but the tyre held its air.

Styling up

I was conflicted about the styling of the wheels and losing the retro feel of the GT1000. Most wire wheels on road bikes have a single disc on the right of the wheel so you can view the whole wheel when it is on its side stand. That's all about style, not performance.

However, Ducati is performance oriented, so they fitted dual discs to the GT1000. Unfortunately, it not only hides the beautiful spoked wheels, but makes



them look cluttered. I think the BST carbon wheels actually clean up the look of the bike. Ok, it's not as retro, but I'm willing to forgo that for the improved performance. Besides, carbon is to Ducati as chrome is to Harley!

I love the fact that the wheels come with horizontal valve stems for easy access. It was previously impossible to use a conventional air hose with the gauge on the fitting. I had to go searching for those automatic air hoses with the smaller fitting which are not as accurate. Another advantage of going from wire wheels to solid wheels is that I don't need tubes. The advantage of tubeless tyres is being able to quickly and cheaply fix a puncture on the side of the road.

These slanted five-spoke wheels are also much easier to wipe clean. The wire wheels were so difficult to clean that they were starting to develop rust where they spokes crossed over as it was difficult to access them with a rag or toothbrush.

There will also be no need to "tune" the spokes to keep the wheel a true circle.

If you love great great craftsmanship you'll love these BST wheels. When they first arrived they spent several days on the dining table where I could examine and admire them. They became a conversation piece with guests until Mrs MBW finally ordered them into the garage!

Conclusion

These carbon wheels cost \$3600 plus fitting. That's a lot to spend on any one motorcycle modification.

However, the benefits are so great and varied, affecting many aspects of the bike, that **they are worth** every cent!



I totally agree with everything mentioned in your article. About 3 years ago I rode a modified and lightened Moto Guzzi Bellagio, equipped with a set of very expensive CF wheels, and couldn't agree more with the dramatic improvements to ride and handling mentioned in your article. The experience of punting this modestly powered motorcycle down the twisty and (then) somewhat poorly surfaced Mt Lindsay Hwy from Rathdowney to the Summerland Way turn-off (a distance of just under 100 kms) was absolutely mindblowing and exhilarating. The lightness of turn-in combined with meaningful jolt-free feedback and a smooth, responsive throttle all added up to motorcycling bliss; an experience which I believe was almost entirely due to the effects of a significant reduction in unsprung weight. My ride was over all too quickly, but my memory is as vivid today as it was at the time. If I could afford it, I would equip every bike I owned with CF wheels before even considering suspension upgrades.

4 Reasons Why You Need to Use Cornering Lines

A "cornering line" is the path you follow around a corner. Riding a narrow, single-track vehicle means we are able to select the left, centre or right positions within the lane. The "basic" cornering line starts by entering the turn at the outside edge of the lane and then continues to the inside or "apex" (near the middle of the corner), and ends with the motorcycle exiting toward the outside of the lane. This line is commonly known as the "outside-inside-outside" line.

Why Bother?

A lot of motorcycle riders don't understand the benefits of cornering lines, believing that it's good enough to simply keep their tires between the painted lines. This is fine when the road is predictable and speeds are low. But, as speeds increase and the road becomes more challenging, precise cornering lines become more important.

Cornering lines are a must when you ride on a racetrack, partly because the pavement is so wide that you would be silly to not use the available real estate. Riding from pavement edge to edge on the racetrack is the equivalent to using the whole width of the lane. Don't cross the painted lines (or lean into the opposite lane), but use the lane to your advantage. Here are the 4 primary benefits of riding cornering lines:

1. Straightens the Curve

Entering the curve from the outside, apexing near the inside and exiting toward the outside straightens the curve by increasing the corner radius, which requires less lean and preserves traction. It's important to have traction in reserve in case you have to increase lean angle or execute a mid-corner manoeuvre.

2. Gives a Better Angle of View

Entering a corner from the outside also allows a better angle of view into the corner so you can get an early look at the corner's characteristics and identify any mid corner hazards so you can adjust your corner entry speed for safety.

3. Increases Cornering Confidence

Actively thinking about and choosing a deliberate path into a through curves makes you a Corner Master who ride with a plan. The result is a more preemptive attitude that puts your eyes, mind and body ahead of the corner.

4. Increases Cornering Enjoyment

Riding cornering lines increases the engagement you have with your bike–and every corner you encounter. Riders who unconsciously stay in the middle of the pavement are passive about their riding and miss out on the opportunity for deeper involvement.

Delayed Apex Line

When you begin your turn (and how quickly you turn) has a significant impact on cornering precision and safety. New or nervous riders are anxious to get the turn over with, so they tend to turn in too soon. This places the bike at the apex too early, pointing the motorcycle toward the outside of the curve. To finish the turn and stay in the lane, the rider is forced to increase lean angle past the apex at the time when they should be reducing lean angle. This is a common reason for corner crashes.

Not only does the delayed apex point the bike safely toward the corner exit and not




at the outside edge of the road, but it also provides the best angle of view into the corner.

Quick Turn

To execute the delayed apex line requires a quick turn-in using firm countersteering. The harder you press on the inside handgrip, the quicker you will turn. Pull on the outside handgrip while pushing on the inside grip to turn in even quicker. Also, pre-position your body to the inside before the turn-in to help the motorcycle fall into the corner with even less effort.

Executing a precise cornering line requires coordination between the timing of your turn-in and the amount of countersteering intensity. Turning in too late and with not enough handlebar force can result in a "missed" apex, causing your motorcycle to stay in the middle or even outside portion of the lane, not near the inside as desired.



Sequential Turns

The basic outside-inside-outside cornering line is the obvious choice if the corner is isolated from other corners with a straight before and after the curve. But, multiple corners strung together can make the outside exit unusable and dangerous.

An outside exit that is appropriate for a single turn may prove too wide if the next corner bends in the opposite direction. In this situation, you have to ride an "outside-inside-INSIDE" line. This means you stay


inside all the way to the exit where it becomes the entrance to the next corner. Depending on the relationship between corners, you may end up with an "outside-inside-MIDDLE" line.

The trick to seamlessly stringing together a series of corners is to look well ahead to identify each corner's radius and determine what the proper entry is for the following corner. The best riders interact with their bike and the corners in a way that turns the road into a dance floor, making the mastery of cornering lines not only safer, but also very satisfying.



Multiple corners require creativity!


