

Membership is open to Riders and Pillions of Cruiser and Tourer motorcycles, as well as Social Members.





I hope everyone is well and happy and I'm looking forward to seeing you at the next meeting.



Steiny, Pyro, Jak, Ace, Kim, Yogi and myself were the riders. Yogi opted for the TEC position.




We then headed back up Numinbah Valley, Nerang, stopped at the BP at Coomera for coffees and a chinwag before heading off home on our separate ways.

Lunch had, and the rain still holding off, we headed to Peak Crossing via Boonah and Kalbar.


Still no real rain!


While inside quenching our thirst and saying our goodbyes there was a small shower that wet the bikes.

Whilst enjoying a calm, leisurely ride up to Mount Glorious recently, Ace's Harley was viciously attacked by a cantankerous, angry snake!


Fortunately, Ace and his Harley were victorious in the brief but bloody battle that followed, and some of the snake's skin was left on the Harley's exhaust:











SPEEDING?

Speed fiend Swiss billionaire slapped with \$320,000 ticket

Swiss pharmaceutical tycoon Ernesto Bertarelli has been fined 310,000 Swiss francs (US\$320,000), after being caught driving 88km per hour in a 50 zone (only 38km/hr over the limit), local media report. While a speeding ticket in most countries might set you back a few hundred dollars at most, that's not always the case in parts of Europe. Ernesto

Bertarelli was caught doing 88km per hour in Crans-près-Céligny, just north of Geneva, Switzerland. Bertarelli was fined 10,000 francs, plus a daily penalty of 3,000 francs for a hundred days.

The fine was calculated based on his wealth, which is estimated by some sources as being up to \$16

billion. Bertarelli, a boating enthusiast and previous winner of the America's Cup yacht race, draws his fortune from the pharmaceutical industry, as well as medical equipment, property and biotech.

Switzerland is not the only country in Europe to issue income-based speeding tickets, which are designed to punish both rich and poor proportionately.

In Finland, for example, a former Nokia executive was fined the equivalent of \$103,000 for going 45 miles per hour in a 30 zone on his motorbike in 2002. More recently, in 2015 businessman Reima Kuisla was fined €54,000 for doing 65 in a 50 zone.

Is the Harley-Davidson Sportster Living On Borrowed Time?

No other bike has had as long a life. But nothing lasts forever.

I don't know how to break the news to you, but our beloved Sportster may not be long for this Earth. Once one of the fastest production bikes available, and truly sporty, the bloom has been off the rose for decades. For a long time now the smaller Harley has been skating by on goodwill and the need for a low-cost, entry-level bike, and slightly sportier Big Twin. There have been attempts at making it sporty again (XR1200) and some really goodlooking factory customs (Seventy-Two), but Harley is at a

crossroads, and I don't think the Sporty is going to make it to the next mile marker.

First, a little history for those with a short memory ...

The Harley-Davidson Sportster first appeared in 1957, though it was based on Model K of five years earlier, and that bike evolved out of a pre-war design. Harley was trying to capture some of the magic of the lighter, quicker British bikes, but the cleanest sheet of paper they could come up with for the design already had an old V-twin doodle on it.

At the time though, the Sporty was the most modern bike Harley made, and one of the fastest anyone made. Then, with minor improvements and upgrades here and there, they made it the same for almost 30 years.

In 1986 the Evo motor brought alloy construction, modern cylinder heads, and eventually 1200cc, and 1991 brought five speeds to the unit-constructed gearbox. Fuel injection allowed more power with less pollution in 2007, and the whole recently.

The Sportster is sportier than any Big Twin Harley is making, but the Street Rod is sportier, and that is just one mark against it.



Exhibit A: Tighter Euro 5 Emission Rules



The Sportster is popular for export markets because it has that unique Harley mystique, but is better sized for use in tighter urban areas.

Currently, under Euro 4 rules in effect since 2013, a Sportster can put out 1.14 g/km of CO, .09 g/km of NOx, and .17 g/km of hydrocarbons. Those numbers are already reduced from Euro 2, which were 2.0 g/km, .15

g/km, and .30 g/km respectively. Unfortunately, 2020 brings in Euro 5, and the limits drop again down to 1.0 g/km for CO, .06 g/km for NOx, and just .10 g/km for hydrocarbons.

Now, Harley officials have said that they have engineers that can get an air-cooled Sportster to meet Euro 5 emissions. And Ducati, Yamaha, and Moto Guzzi all have air-cooled models that they don't seem in a hurry to replace. But the Euro 4 rules have been given as one of the reasons for the elimination of the V-Rod from the lineup. The Ducati and Moto Guzzi Twins do have a long history, but unlike the Sportster, they have had constant and extensive revisions over the past 30 years. The Yamaha Star Bolt 950 was drawn up from a clean sheet of paper in the last 10 years, and their big V-twin debuted in the late 1990s, and it has been revised several times since.

In order for the Sportster to blow clean you have to assume it needs a substantial going over, top to bottom, to lower friction, lower engine noise, control heat, and burn cleaner.

Exhibit B: Labour Costs

We've already established that the Sportster has been around for a long, long time, with just evolutionary changes. The Street 500 and 750 were designed in the 21st-century, specifically to be able to be produced at a low price point, even when made in America. Despite being a premium product, Harley-Davidson says one of the biggest pluses of the new 2018 Softails with the Milwaukee 8 is that they cost less to make. And we all



know the new Milwaukee 8 motor was designed for CNC machining and automated assembly, which likely makes it actually costs less than an old tech Sportster mill.

The most expensive part of any product made in America is the labor involved in making it, and it takes hundreds of people to screw together a Sportster. Despite the price difference, obviously it costs the same in labor to build an 883 as it does to build a 1200, so the Motor Company is likely losing money on every one of those \$8,999 Sportsters it sells.

One of the best things going for the Sportster has always been its performance reputation, borrowed from the XR750. Without the XR on the track anymore, the Sportster really is just a little brother trying to hang with the bigger kids.

In revamping the Big Twin chassis Harley got rid of 50 component parts and eliminated 22 percent of all welds, compared to the Dyna. A good portion of that was the elimination of the rubber mounting system. That old Dyna chassis only dated back to 2006, and the rubber mounted Sportster debuted in 2004, so you can see how the chassis needs an update too.

But in order to make the new, stiffer, lighter, cheaper Softail, the motor had to be solidly mounted and fully counterbalanced. You can assume, in order to meet emissions regulations, cost-cutting goals, and performance ideals, the Sportster motor will have to be updated more completely than even the Evo was.

Exhibit C: The XG750R Flat Tracker



the 750cc XG motor.

In 2017, Harley had a bad year in the racing debut of its new Street 750-based XG750R flat tracker. But many people think it already makes more power than the previous XR750 race bike. More than 50 years into the development of the Sportster-based XR750, it was making about 100 hp in the hands of a skilled tuner. From its first race, Vance and Hines managed to find 110 hp in

One of the best things going for the Harley-Davidson Sportster has always been its performance reputation, borrowed from the flat track XR750 race bike. Without the XR on the track anymore, and with that coolness now conferred to the Street 750, the Sportster really is just a little brother trying to hang with the bigger kids.

Stock Street 750 examples (not the hotted-up Street Rod), make about five and a half fewer pound-feet of torque than a Sportster 883, at the same rpm. At the Sportster's power peak of 5,500 rpm, it outguns the Street by maybe 5 horsepower. So, you can see they are very close to equal, despite the extra 133 cc of displacement.

But the reason the new XG750R makes more power, and the reason the Sportster may be doomed, is that the Revolution X motor will just keep on revving. The Street 750 puts out 10 hp more than the Sportster 883 at its 8,000 rpm redline, or nearly 58 hp. The similarly-designed motor in the 1130cc V-rod was good for more than 100 hp at the rear wheel. Obviously, the Street is being hamstrung by the factory so it won't embarrass the more expensive Sportster.

Exhibit D: Kansas City Plant Closing

At the end of January 2018, management announced that the Kansas City, Missouri, Harley-Davidson assembly plant would be closing by the end of 2019. Kansas City is one of iust four factories that





Harley has in the U.S. that produces bikes and parts, with a fifth factory in India producing the Street 500 and 750 for Asian markets. There is also an assembly plant in Brazil for South American markets, and a wheel factory in Australia, which is also closing. The Kansas City factory previously had built the V-Rod and Dyna lines, and still produces the Street 500 and 750 and Sportster.

The new 2018 Softail/Dyna consolidated model lineup is now being assembled in the York, Pennsylvania,

factory, where the touring bikes, trikes, and CVO models have been built for years. The new Milwaukee 8-powered cruisers were redesigned to be easier to assemble, and you can bet they were designed to be built up with the facilities at the York plant. The Street bikes are already being put together in India for many foreign markets, and a new Thailand factory is being built, so even if U.S. production falls, there is no chance of it stopping altogether, although U.S. content in them may go down a bit.

That leaves the Sportster without a home, and the major undertaking of shifting 100% of production to York and/or redesigning it to meet the new Euro 5 pollution standards. Oh, and there are new USA Tier 3 emissions rules coming about that time too, bringing the rest of the country into line with the rules California has imposed.

<u>PS</u>: In the humble opinion of your Editor, the Harley Sportster is easily the best looking Harley, if not the best looking bike in the World. It would be sad to see it go!

WAZE

WAZE is a turn-by-turn navigation app that's available for both Android and Apple smartphones. It's free, and has an installed userbase of up to a massive 500 million users! As a navigator it's pretty good - as good a Google Maps. The big thing about WAZE is that it's "Wiki"-based. Ordinary users can (and do!) easily report on mobile and fixed speed traps, red light cameras, any heavy traffic, accidents, and absolutely anything else that's happening on the road.

Some other navigators warn you as you're approaching a <u>fixed</u> speed camera, or a fixed red light camera; but only WAZE can warn you about temporary speed cameras (that might only be set up for 30 minutes at a time). In particular, it usually will warn you about the presence of the notorious "autonomous speed camera trailers" that are so loved by our local constabulary.

By its nature, the Wiki-feedback and user reporting in WAZE works best in densely populated areas, and for that reason it's insanely popular in places like Europe; but it still works very well in Brisbane.

For example: as I was driving north along the Gateway Motorway a few weeks ago it warned me as I approached the location of the speed camera trailers that are usually set up somewhere along that road. As I drove further north along the Bruce Highway it warned me as I approached a couple of speed camera vans parked by the side of the road. Pretty good! Worth trying it out if you're interested.

How to break in new motorcycle tyres

Do you know how to break in new motorcycle tyres that come with a glossy and slippery surface? They deserve to be treated with respect and caution. It seems strange that new tyres have a glossy surface, but there are a few reasons for this. Some manufacturers use a slippery chemical called a release agent to get the rubber

tyres to release cleanly from the mould. However, modern moulds have teflon coatings that obviate the need for a release agent. Even if they don't use a release agent, tyre manufacturers use chemicals in the curing process to make the rubber flow better and reduce defects in the surface and tread pattern. This results in slick or glossy surfaces.

Apparently riders also like to see a new tyre looking glossy in the showroom, even though they can be slippery. So even if a tyre manufacturer like Dunlop, Continental or Pirelli don't use a release agent, they still make their tyres look glossy for consumer appeal. So how do you break them in and get rid of the slippery gloss? Well, some tyre fitters use sanders to scuff up the surface or wash them with an acetone solution to neutralise the oily release agent or wipe them with a cloth to get rid of any slippery fitting lubricant they may have spilt on the tyre surface.

But tyre manufacturers do NOT recommend washing or sanding your tyres. They go to great lengths to design and engineer tyre treads, so the last thing you should do is attack the tread surface with a belt sander! It is also a bit risky using any chemical solution on a tyre as you do not know if it will be applied evenly and how it will react with the tyre. A wipe with a dry cloth is fine. Notice that race bikes leave the pits with shiny new tyres that have not been belt-sanded or washed with any chemicals.

The best way to break in a tyre, lose that gloss and become sticky is to heat it up and the most effective way to heat a tyre is over a long-distance high-speed highway ride. Racers don't have that luxury, so they use tyre warmers which they apply about an hour before a race to warm the tyre slowly and evenly.

Since most riders don't have access to tyre warmers, tyre manufacturers suggest a long ride of 160-200km to heat the tyres. Despite the fact that most racers weave around on warmed-up tyres, you actually don't need to lean the bike over on to the new and glossy surface to heat up that part of the tyre. Acceleration and braking is more effective as it puts stress on the tyre carcass which heats up the whole tyre, not just the bit touching the road. But again, you should get the tyre hot before any abrupt throttle or brake application.

Don't think in terms of "scrubbing in" your tyres, but think about heating them up. The distance required to get sufficient heat into them can be dependent on the type of bike, the ambient temperature, the temperature of the road and the road surface.

Before you can start to push the lean limits, get off your bike and feel the tyre temperature with your hand. If it's hot, you can gradually increase acceleration and braking to get it really hot. Then you should be right to start leaning it over.







ARE YOU IN THE CORRECT TRACK WHEN CORNERING?



Green arrow = GOOD. Red arrow = BAD!

Start a <u>left</u> hand corner with your bike in the <u>right</u>-hand track (of your lane), and <u>stay there</u> until you are almost through the corner and you can clearly see the corner's exit.

For a right hand corner, do the opposite!

When going around a **left-hand corner**, start the corner with your bike in the right-hand track (of your lane). That's the lane track closest to the road's centreline. Don't be in the left-hand track. Don't be in the middle of your lane. Be in the right-hand track (of your lane), and stay in the right hand track until you are almost through the corner and you can clearly see the corner's exit.

When going around a **right-hand corner**, it's the opposite: start the corner with your bike in the left-hand track (of your lane). That's the lane track closest to the road edge. Stay in the left hand track until you can clearly see the corner's exit.


<u>LEFT</u> HAND CORNER = USE THE <u>RIGHT</u> HAND TRACK CLOSEST TO THE ROAD'S CENTRELINE.

<u>RIGHT</u> HAND CORNER = USE THE <u>LEFT</u> HAND TRACK CLOSEST TO THE ROAD'S EDGE.

By adopting the above approach you will be safer, your lean angle through the corner will be <u>much</u> less, you'll be able to go through the corner faster (if you want to), you'll be less likely to collide with oncoming traffic, and you'll be far less likely to crash.

Practice this, and do it always!!


