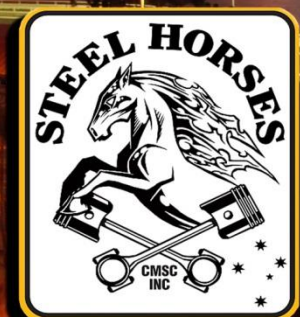

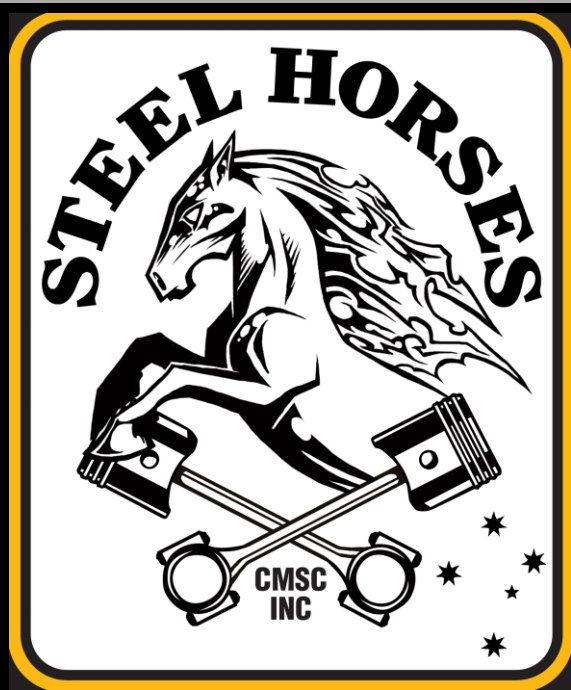

Membership:

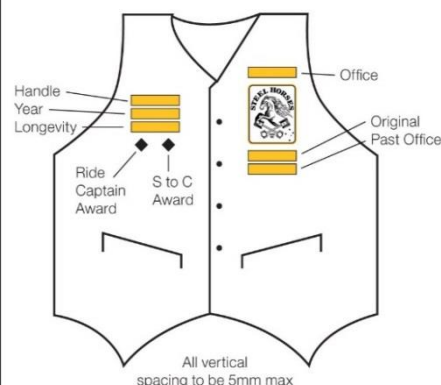
Membership is open to Riders and Pillions of Cruiser and Tourer motorcycles & Social Members.

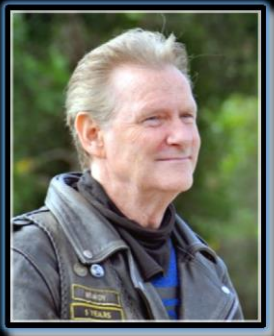

Ride Day one

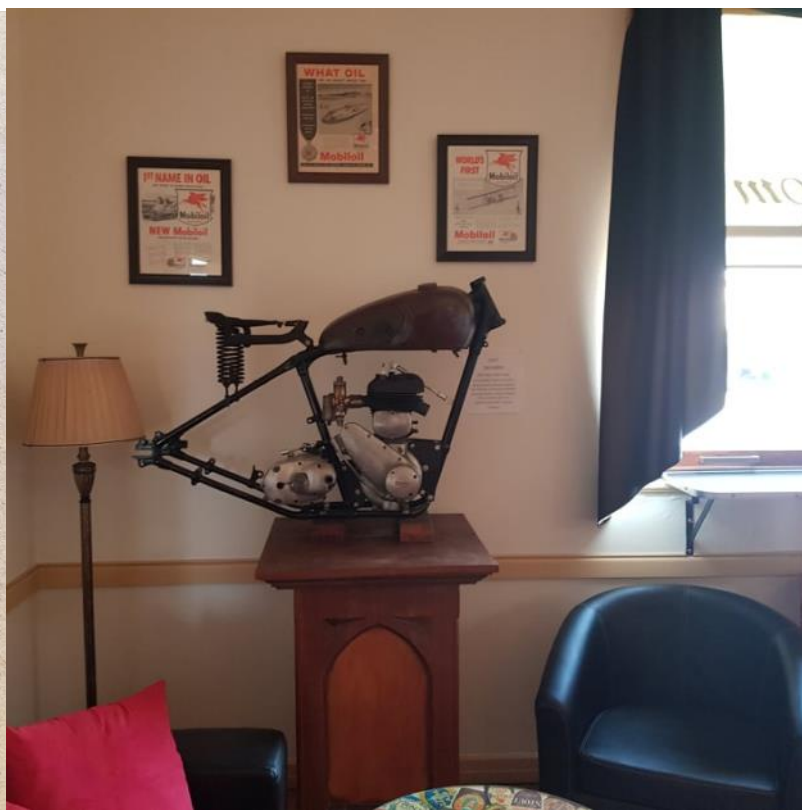

The Hideaway Motel in Armidale was comfy and pleasant with a much needed pool. Only negative was that it must have been a crap bitumen job in the car park. Walking passed the bike about half an hour after parking it I noticed the bitumen had moved under the front wheel then looked at the stand. Lucky I had a stand support Hippy made and given to me...meant to be for wet grass...but did the job well.

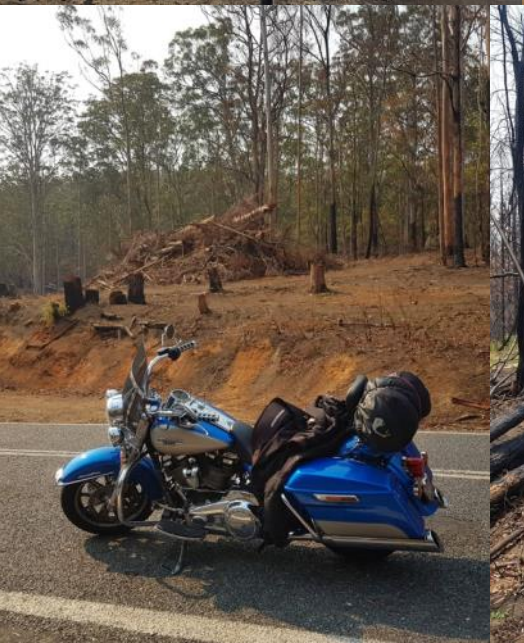




Ride Day two

I headed from Armidale to Walcha at 7am riding carefully on the lookout for roos. After an uneventful ride to Walcha and breakfast at the Royal cafe and looking around their collection of unusual bikes and bits and pieces I headed to the Oxley highway. I have an app that updates current NSW road conditions and the Oxley had been closed for several weeks after being ravaged by fire but had reopened with one 13km section only usable one way at a time under escort. Travelling along the Oxley I could see the devastation that fire had caused with thousands of trees close to the road having been cut down. When I got to the escorted section there was a 15 minute wait and then I got to see this part that was much more badly damaged and signs and armco railings melted and twisted. The good thing was that another bike and I were at the front of traffic and for the last 50 kms to Wauchope there was no traffic to contend with and we made the most of it. I arrived in Port Macquarie early afternoon and after settling in at Kaye's mum's place we headed out to spend New Years eve with her family.

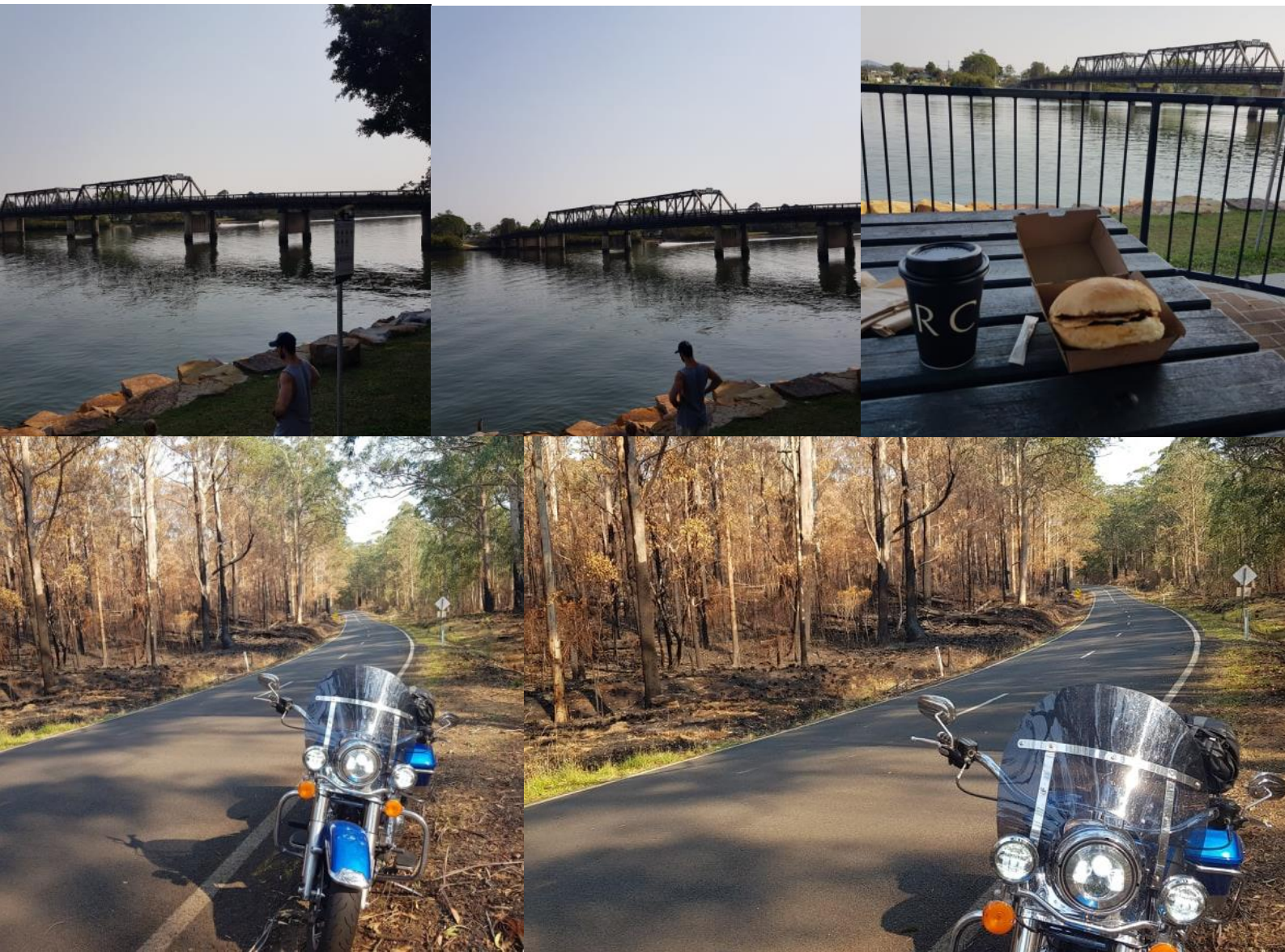




The next four days were spent catching up with family and friends with drinks and meals and trips to the lovely beaches around Port Macquarie

Ride day three

I headed off from Port Macquarie bound for Dorrigo and the mountain roads between there and Grafton where I was booked in to a motel for the night. The highway ride to the Dorrigo turnoff was mostly 110kph speed limit and as I had an early start it was pretty much clear of traffic. Turning off the highway I was stopped by the only cop I saw all day for a roadside breath test and after I passed he said "nice bike" and sent me on my way. I stopped for breakfast at a cafe on the river at Macsville and sat across the road right on the river's edge. Turning off the highway the road was clear but unfortunately as I got to the mountains it choked up with traffic. So I stopped and started several times to give myself clear road until I caught up with the traffic again. I stopped for a long break to look around Dorrigo. I have only been there in winter before and it has been pretty desolate. But being a Saturday with warm temps and a local market happening it was buzzing with activity and hard to find a parking space. Back on the road I travelled up the Tyringham road then on to Armidale road. Tyringham Road is a nice quiet country road with 100kph limit that would probably be 60km in Qld. It was a fun ride. On to Armidale road which had been closed for a couple of weeks as it had been ravaged by fire. The scenery was bleak and blackened and there were many patches of gravel on corners that slowed me down after losing the back end a couple of times. Like the Oxley highway the burned out trees and charred landscape had a surreal feel to it, but the road was fun to ride and I made it into Grafton just after 1.30pm in time to have a beer and a swim at the motel.





Ride day four

I left Grafton at 7.30am NSW time and had a traffic free run through to Kyogle where I had my first break. I left Kyogle thinking I could meet up with the first break of the Steel Horses ride as it was a south ride with the first break at the Burnside tavern Yatala. I made it there just after 10am and met up with Pyro, Phoenix, Ace and Drastic. I left them there as they continued their ride.

So luckily the Oxley Highway and Armidale road were both open for me to enjoy. On the down side the amount of burnt trees were a sad sight and a stark reminder of the problems being endured by the majority of the people in NSW. Even if they aren't directly impacted their businesses will be suffering... I spoke to a young woman that Mac and I had seen in a cafe in Dorrigo on the way back from Bowraville. They haven't been in business that long and November and December which should be bumper months were quiet as people were keeping away from the area not knowing how fires were impacting Dorrigo. As someone said to me recently we all need to get out and spend money in these small towns that have been affected to help them recover.

The app uses a mobile phone's GPS functionality so callers can provide emergency call-takers with their location information as determined by their smart phone. 'Emergency+' also includes SES and Police Assistance Line numbers as options, so non-emergency calls are made to the most appropriate number. When calling Triple Zero (000), remember to stay focused, stay relevant, and stay on the line.

Before you call, ask yourself:

- * Is someone seriously injured or in need of urgent medical help?
- * Is your life or property being threatened?
- * Have you just witnessed a serious accident or crime? If you answered 'Yes' to any of these questions, call Triple Zero (000). Triple Zero calls are free.

Queensland Safety Certificates

If you're buying a used motorcycle you need to ensure there's a current Queensland safety certificate displayed. A safety certificate identifies the authorised inspection station (AIS) that's issued the certificate, and it must be displayed on the motorcycle from the time it's offered for sale.

If you're selling a registered motorcycle, you'll need to obtain and display a Queensland safety certificate from the moment you offer the motorcycle for sale.

What is a safety certificate?

A safety certificate's issued after a motorcycle passes an minimum safety standard inspection. A safety certificate covers basic things that could affect the safe operation of the vehicle, including:

- tyres
- brakes
- steering
- suspension
- rust or damage
- lights

The safety certificate offers buyers better protection and makes sure vehicles being offered for disposal or being re-registered are safe - reducing the likelihood of crashes caused by defective vehicles.

When is a safety certificate required?

You're required to display a safety certificate on any registered motorcycle from the moment you offer the vehicle for sale, including when you:

- list the vehicle for sale online; or
- place the vehicle in public offering it for sale; or
- ride the vehicle while displaying a sign such as *For Sale - Phone 1234 5678*

Note: You're required to obtain and display a safety certificate on a registered motorcycle when it is being offered for sale, even if you plan cancelling the registration when the motorcycle's sold.

Unregistered second hand and registered interstate motorcycles must have a safety certificate as part of the Queensland pre-registration process (unless exempt).

Safety certificates must be displayed on a motorcycle in a conspicuous place, i.e. front forks or guard.

Failure to display a Queensland Department of Transport and Main Roads Safety Certificate on the motorcycle from the time it's first offered for sale can carry an on-the-spot fine penalty of \$550.

When is a safety certificate not needed?

Selling a motorcycle without a safety certificate

Motorcycles that are unregistered or are traded to, or between, licensed motor dealers do not require a safety certificate. Motorcycles can still be sold for parts but they must be de-registered before being offered for sale.

Transferring a vehicle without a safety certificate

You don't need a safety certificate if the motorcycle meets one of the exemption criteria. Some exemption situations may include:

- the disposer being in an exempt area
- a beneficiary of a deceased estate
- between spouses, including separated spouses
- remote locations

For more information on exemptions, phone 13 23 80.

How long are safety certificates current for?

The time a safety certificate is valid for varies depending on who is selling the vehicle:

- licensed motor dealers: certificates are valid for 3 months or 1000km (whichever comes first) from date of issue
- all other sellers: certificates are valid for 2 months or 2000km (whichever comes first) from date of issue

The same safety certificate can be used to register an unregistered vehicle and to transfer the registration of that vehicle, provided it is within the limits set out above.

A new safety certificate is needed each time you sell the vehicle even if it is within the limits above. A single safety certificate cannot be used for two transfers.

Who issues safety certificates?

Safety certificates can only be issued by approved inspection stations. **Motorcycle Roadworthys** is an approved inspection station and will travel to your home, your place of work, or wherever your motorcycle happens to be to undertake an inspection and issue a safety certificate.

Minimise the chance of your motorcycle failing first inspection

A failed safety certificate inspection is inconvenient and time consuming, and more often than not it's only minor and easily rectifiable faults that prevent a pass; faults you could've identified and fixed prior to inspection.

For a better understanding of what a vehicle inspector looks for and to help identify possible reasons for inspection rejection, visit www.safetycert.info to access the *Queensland Department of Transport and Main Roads Code of Practice - Vehicle Inspection Guidelines*.

Although vehicle inspection is subjective and inspection guidelines are open to varying interpretation from inspector to inspector, if you follow the guidelines section by section whilst carrying out your own inspection, you should be able to identify and remedy any existing faults prior to a safety certificate inspection.

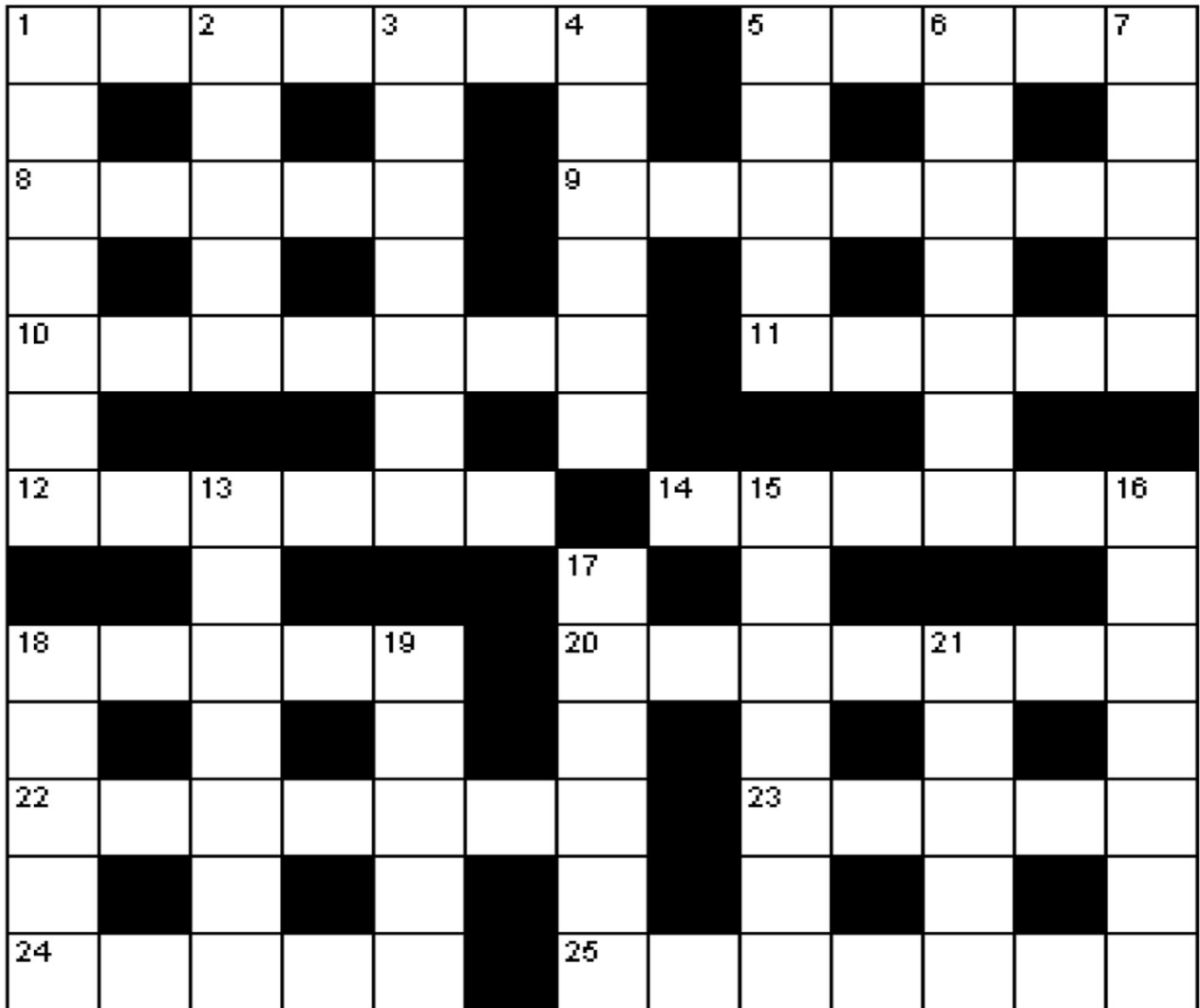
