Membership:


Membership is open to Riders and Pillions of Cruiser and Tourer motorcycles & Social Members.

ROWDY'S RANT THE PRESIDENTS REPORT




Hi everyone and welcome to the April Newsletter



Norton Motorcycles boss under investigation

Failed Norton Motorcycle boss Stuart Garner is in more strife with the UK Pensions regulator now investigating his role in a pension scheme to fraudulently fund his company.

In January, Norton Motorcycles went into administration amid claims of **pension** fund frauds and a £300,000 unpair tax bill.

In 2012 and 2013, 228 pensioners invested in five-year pension funds (Commando 2012 Pension Scheme, the Dominator 2012 Pension Scheme, and the Donington MC Pension Scheme) which invested primarily in Norton Motorcycles.

Trustee of all funds and sole director of their provider, Manocrest Ltd, was Stuart Garner.

The pensioners claim their investment was not returned years after the lock-in period had expired and £14 million in investments were lost in the company collapse.

In February, Garner failed to appear at a public hearing held by the Pensions Ombudsman to investigate complaints about the pension schemes.

Under investigation



It's taken until now for the Pensions Regulator to launch an investigation.

Last year the Pensions Ombudsman criticised Garner for a "clear" conflict of interest as trustee of schemes that invested all funds into his business.

"It appears to me that the investment of all of the scheme's assets in Norton Motorcycle Holdings is potentially in breach of the restrictions on employer-related investments under section 40 of the Pensions Act 1995." the ombudsman said.

Garner faces a fine and/or jail if found guilty of a conflict of interest.

Despite being chased by investors, customers, the government and now the Pensions Regulator, Garner and his wife, Susie, were last month **spotted dining out at an elite Yorkshire restaurant**, The Ivy, where a steak costs about £30 (about \$A60).

The photo was published on the **Twitter account Notnorton Moto** as another example of Garner's extravagant lifestyle.

At least in Australia, importers **Brisbane Motorcycles** have returned deposits to those who paid for bikes not yet delivered.

The UK government is now being called on to investigate almost £8m in funding and loans amid claims that Garner squandered the money on ast cars and a lavish lifestyle.

Buyers sought



Norton's Donington Hall factory

The company ceased production in February, but administrators BDO UK say they have "significant interest" from potential buyers.

BDO spokesman Lee Causer says they are "taking all necessary steps to ensure that customers, staff and suppliers are supported through the administration process, as we seek the sale of the business and assets".


"We have had a significant volume of interest and are hopeful that a sale of Norton Motorcycles (UK) Ltd can be secured," he says.

That's good news for Norton fans and customers.



Garner relaxes at home

The rumour mill has been running hot with talk of Japanese and Chinese motorcycle companies and even motorcycle fan **Keanu Reeves** being interested in buying the venerable brand.

A petition to Triumph Motorcycles boss John Bloor to buy the company has only received 61 signatures.

Meanwhile, another petition to the government to launch an official inquiry into Garner has more than 7000 signatures.

SuperBike Magazine claims the company's biggest single investor, Steve Murray, could be interested in buying the company.

They say he invested his entire life savings or about £1 million for 10% equity and loaned the company an extra £500,000.

He was a company director for three months, but chose to be "hands-off".

The deadline for bidders closed on 21 February 2020. There has been no update from the administrators.

Man charged over ploughing into riders

A 52-year-old man has been charged today (26 March 2020) after his Kia Rio ploughed head-on into a group of riders in Kyogle, northern NSW, killing one and injuring four others on Sunday, 20 October 2019.

The six riders were all part of the **Sons Of The Southern Cross Social Motorcycle Club** who were heading south out of Kyogle at the time.

One of the motorcycle riders, Wes "Pop" Carlton, 55, suffered critical injuries and sadly died at the scene.

Another rider, a 56-year-old man, suffered serious injuries and was taken to Lismore Base Hospital before being airlifted to Gold Coast University Hospital in a serious but stable condition.

The other two riders, aged 52 and 53, suffered serious injuries and were taken to Lismore Base Hospital for treatment.

The injured riders were named as "Smiley, Wellsy and Browny".

Two more riding in the SOTSC group were not hit.

Driver charged

The driver and sole-occupant of the car, a 52-year-old man, was trapped for a short time before being released and taken to Lismore Hospital for treatment and mandatory testing

Officers from Richmond Police District established a crime scene, which was examined by the Far North Coast Crash Investigations Unit.

Following extensive inquiries, the 52-year-old driver was arrested today (Thursday 26 March 2020) at his Warwick home in Queensland.

He was charged with dangerous driving occasioning death, three counts of dangerous driving occasioning grievous bodily harm, negligent driving occasioning death, negligent driving occasioning grievous bodily harm, and driver not keep left of centre dividing line.

His licence has been suspended and he is set to face Kyogle Local Court on Wednesday 10 June 2020.

Our sincere condolences to the families and friends of all riders killed and our best wishes for a full and speedy recovery for all those injured in these crashes.

Group crashes


But the most tragic was the <u>crash in North America where an unlicensed pick-up truck driver</u> ploughed into 10 bikes, killing seven riders.

More motorcycle factory closures during pandemic

The **list of motorcycle factory closures** due to the coronavirus pandemic is growing daily with MV Agusta and Indian Motorcycles finally joining.

The MV factory on the shores of beautiful Lake Varese in Lombardy, an early epicentre of the virus in Italy, had been continuing with a reduced workforce.

Now they have announced that from tomorrow (26 March 2020) will cease all activities until the production ban is lifted, whenever that might be.

Polaris is closing all its five factories in the USA, plus factories in Mexico and Poland.

The Piaggio Group had temporarily closed over a recent weekend for cleaning, but has now closed until April 3, affecting production of Moto Guzzi, Aprilia and Vespa.

They join other Italian motorcycle, car and automotive component factories in shutting down.

Other automotive factories have closed across Europe and Asia and Harley-Davidson in the USA has closed its factories.

What closures mean to riders

Motorcycle factory closures may not have a huge impact on the supply of models as demand will also be down.

However, it could impact the supply of spare parts.

The closure of component factories such as Brembo will also hamper the supply chain and the production of many models such as BMW and Triumph.


Not that we may be able to lawfully ride soon, anyway.

Pandemic: Is it still legal to ride?

The official view is that it is still legal to go for a leisure ride during the pandemic restrictions so long as riders are not in groups of more than two.

This rule comes into force from midnight tonight (30 March 2020). Unfortunately, some of the rules have such big holes you could ride a Goldwing through them!

So we contacted the state health authorities, the national coronavirus hotline and the Prime Minister's office for an official interpretation.

While there are no rules restricting travel, except between some states, the recommendations are that travel be limited to: Shopping; medical care or compassionate needs; exercise; and for work and education.

So you can legally ride to the shops, doctor, work and education facility without copping a massive on-the-spot fine.

We also asked if leisure riding was exempt because it is good for mental and physical health as per this article.

The official answer is yes, so long as you do not ride in a group of more than two. It sounds rather like Queensland's **Draconian Vicious Lawless Association Disestablishment Act (VLAD)** of 2013.

They say riding is classed as a leisure activity or exercise.

"However, that could change," warns the hotline operator.

"We haven't closed everything down at the moment, but there may be more stringent conditions coming."

Aged riders

The Prime Minister's office also gave "strong advice" that people aged 70, anybody over 60 with a chronic illness and Indigenous people over 50 should stay home and self-isolate.

That rules out many riders as a growing number are "mature-aged". The mature-aged riding club, Ulysses, has not directed members to stop riding.



In an open letter to members, Road Safety Committee spokesman Terry McCarthy says riding helps de-stress:

"Staying indoors or around our property may drive some of us stir crazy. We also are worrying about family and friends and how they may be coping in these difficult times. A coping mechanism may be going for a ride. Riding a motorcycle/scooter allows us to socially distance ourselves and comply with requirements presently in force. It may be the best way to relive your anxiety and stress in a safe manner."

The Ulysses Club recommends that if you do go riding, you practise good hygiene and social distancing, carry hand cleaner and your own food and drink, avoid public gatherings, and self-isolate if you are sick.

Responsible actions

Just because it's not yet law doesn't mean we should be heading out for a ride as often as we would like.

That not only gives a bad public impression of riders, but it's not in the spirit of the recommendations and suggestions.

We contacted police in several states who are patrolling for non-compliance and have been advised of several on-the-spot fines of thousands of dollars being handed out.

"We need everyone on the same page to ensure we are not putting more people at risk," Victoria Police said.

Police in several states say they are particularly patrolling borders and "areas where people congregate" which could include riders gathering at cafes and scenic spots.

As we have seen, restrictions are ramped up every few days in response to a lack of compliance in the population.

The slower we are to obey directions, the more restrictive are the rules imposed. We may soon even see riding ruled out!

It also prolongs the duration that many riding brothers and sisters are out of work.

Thankfully, we are seeing a lot of riders complying with the recommendations, ceasing group rides and staying home to work on or clean their bike.


The good news is that a **McCrindle Research** online study of 1015 Australians last week found 86% are adhering to government advice to stop the spread of Coronavirus.

Hopefully, 86% of riders are also doing the responsible thing and limiting their riding.

Queensland Safety Certificates

If you're buying a used motorcycle you need to ensure there's a current Queensland safety certificate displayed. A safety certificate identifies the authorised inspection station (AIS) that's issued the certificate, and it must be displayed on the motorcycle from the time it's offered for sale.

If you're selling a registered motorcycle, you'll need to obtain and display a Queensland safety certificate from the moment you offer the motorcycle for sale.

What is a safety certificate?

A safety certificate's issued after a motorcycle passes an minimum safety standard inspection. A safety certificate covers basic things that could affect the safe operation of the vehicle, including:

- tyres
- brakes
- steering
- suspension
- · rust or damage
- lights

The safety certificate offers buyers better protection and makes sure vehicles being offered for disposal or being re-registered are safe - reducing the likelihood of crashes caused by defective vehicles.

When is a safety certificate required?

You're required to display a safety certificate on any registered motorcycle from the moment you offer the vehicle for sale, including when you:

- list the vehicle for sale online; or
- place the vehicle in public offering it for sale; or
- ride the vehicle while displaying a sign such as For Sale Phone 1234 5678

Note: You're required to obtain and display a safety certificate on a registered motorcycle when it is being offered for sale, even if you plan cancelling the registration when the motorcycle's sold.

Unregistered second hand and registered interstate motorcycles must have a safety certificate as part of the Queensland pre-registration process (unless exempt).

Safety certificates must be displayed on a motorcycle in a conspicuous place, i.e. front forks or guard.

Failure to display a Queensland Department of Transport and Main Roads Safety Certificate on the motorcycle from the time it's first offered for sale can carry an on-the-spot fine penalty of \$550.

When is a safety certificate not needed?

Selling a motorcycle without a safety certificate

Motorcycles that are unregistered or are traded to, or between, licensed motor dealers do not require a safety certificate. Motorcycles can still be sold for parts but they must be de-registered before being offered for sale.

Transferring a vehicle without a safety certificate

You don't need a safety certificate if the motorcycle meets one of the exemption criteria. Some exemption situations may include:

- · the disposer being in an exempt area
- · a beneficiary of a deceased estate
- · between spouses, including separated spouses
- · remote locations

For more information on exemptions, phone 13 23 80.

How long are safety certificates current for?

The time a safety certificate is valid for varies depending on who is selling the vehicle:

- · licensed motor dealers: certificates are valid for 3 months or 1000km (whichever comes first) from date of issue
- · all other sellers: certificates are valid for 2 months or 2000km (whichever comes first) from date of issue

The same safety certificate can be used to register an unregistered vehicle and to transfer the registration of that vehicle, provided it is within the limits set out above.

A new safety certificate is needed each time you sell the vehicle even if it is within the limits above. A single safety certificate cannot be used for two transfers.

Who issues safety certificates?

Safety certificates can only be issued by approved inspection stations. **Motorcycle Roadworthys** is an approved inspection station and will travel to your home, your place of work, or wherever your motorcycle happens to be to undertake an inspection and issue a safety certificate.

Minimise the chance of your motorcycle failing first inspection

A failed safety certificate inspection is inconvenient and time consuming, and more often than not it's only minor and easily rectifiable faults that prevent a pass; faults you could've identified and fixed prior to inspection.

For a better understanding of what a vehicle inspector looks for and to help identify possible reasons for inspection rejection, visit www.safetycert.info to access the Queensland Department of Transport and Main Roads Code of Practice - Vehicle Inspection Guidelines.

Although vehicle inspection is subjective and inspection guidelines are open to varying interpretation from inspector to inspector, if you follow the guidelines section by section whilst carrying out your own inspection, you should be able to identify and remedy any existing faults prior to a safety certificate inspection.


